TRANSFORMED VS. CONFORMED

Romans 12:1-2 (NKJV)

“I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.”

In presenting ourselves to God as living sacrificed, Paul tells us to be TRANSFORMED, rather than CONFORMED to the world. Conformed is being similar to or, in this case, to behave as... To look like and behave like the world. Transformed is to be dramatically changed in some way... To be changed from the form and likeness of the world. This is what Paul teaches and what God desires of our lives, in order that they may be offered to Him as a sacrifice.

It is much easier to be conformed than to be transformed. We live in the world. We see nothing but the world. It is easy for us to mimic what we see.

But that also means it is that much harder to be changed from what we may see as normal. Scripture teaches that we become new, a new creation, through the blood of Christ Who died for us (2 Corinthians 5:17; Galatians 6:15). He desires, not that we be like what we see in the world, but more like the example set before us by Christ. Paul urges that we imitate him, but only as he imitates Christ (1 Cor. 11:1).

You may not be changed by the world all at once. The frog in the boiling pot... It will most likely come a little at a time, as we continue to live in this world of evil and darkness. **Beware that you not be changed BY the world, but that you be changed FROM the world!**

ANSWER: C. David (1 Samuel 21:10-15)

The correct answer is C, David. In 1 Samuel 21:10-15 while on the run from King Saul, David decided to take refuge in the City of Gath, a city of the Philistines.
