6. What is the point in David’s statement (vs. 9-10)?
7. Could the Gentiles have been saved without the “fall” of Israel?
8. In what sense did the Israelites become “jealous?”
9. Paul’s ministry was especially among what people?
10. The “wild olive” (vs. 17) refers to whom?
11. What “branches” were “broken off?”
12. Who are the “natural branches?”
13. What does verse 22 show about the nature of God?
14. Can an unbeliever become a believer? Can a believer become an unbeliever?
15. What is the meaning of “and so all Israel shall be saved?” (vs. 26)
16. With the end of vs. 36, which major section of the book comes to a close?
