THE FAMILY OF GOD

In Ephesians 3:14-15, Paul would write, *“For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named.”* God is the Father and Christ is the Son in this spiritual family. In the letter to the churches of Galatia, he would write, *“For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus.”* (Galatians 3:26)

One of the sad things about the church of the 21st century is that we seem to have lost this concept of being a family. We often treat the church like it is a service club such as the Lions Club or the Rotary Club. Or we think it is a country club where we have certain privileges but no responsibilities. Then again, we often treat the church like we do our politics.

This idea of “family” is one of the major themes of the Bible. All throughout the Bible, God has a group of people who are His people. His family. They are set apart and protected by God.

God is pictured to us as a loving father, a father who wants to bless and care for His children. God has grafted me into the family tree of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. When I was baptized into Christ, I became a child of Abraham, an heir according to promise. Because I submitted myself to the kingship of Jesus, He gave me the right to become God’s child and call God my Father.

In Christ, the family story of the Bible is my family story. I’m getting the opportunity to live out that family story with the church every day of my life. And I am overwhelmed with gratitude that God has allowed me to be part of His people, to have a seat at His banquet table, to be a citizen of His heavenly kingdom and to share in the inheritance He is giving to His people.

That is what it means to be part of the church and that is why I am thankful.



We need to be sure to realize that the church is a family and treat it as such. We are to love each other and we are to care for each other.

We need to remember the words of the song we sing at the beginning of our Worship each Lord’s day, “The Family of God”...by Bill Gaither. As we sing that song to begin our period of worship, listen carefully to the words, take them to heart and rejoice that we are a part of God’s Family.



Ephesians 4:29-30, "Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers. And grieve not the Holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption."
