

LET'S VISIT

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REJOICE IN THE LORD!

In the final chapter of Philippians, we find Paul exhorting the brethren. He is exhorting them specifically and generally. In verses one through three, he gives specific exhortations to individuals. He tells them to stand fast in the Lord. Then, in verse four, we find the first of several exhortations which are certainly needful for all Christians.

The passage in the KJV reads, "Rejoice in the Lord always and again I say, Rejoice." Personally, I like the way the passage reads in Philips translation, "Delight yourselves in God, yes, find your joy in him at all times."

The keynote of this epistle is joy. Paul uses the word joy or one of its derivatives no less than 16 times in this short letter. He mentions it in verses 4, 18 and 25 of chapter one and it is actually mentioned twice in verse 18. In chapter two he mentions joy in verses 2, 17, 18, 28 and 29 and it is mentioned twice in verses 17 and 18. He mentions it in verse 1 of chapter three and in verses 1, 4 and 10 of chapter four with it being mentioned twice in verse 4.

This joy in the Lord is a joy to be experienced always. It is not just an occasional experience for exceptional people. We are to rejoice in darkness as well as light, in prosperity and adversity as well as in trials and triumphs.

Paul was one of God's choicest saints. He found joy in his prayers. He found joy in the proclamation of the gospel even under adverse circumstances. He found joy in the unity of the saints as well as the prospect of being a martyr for Christ. Paul found joy in the love of the brethren, for truly Paul rejoiced always.

Though we may sometimes find temporary joy, abiding joy is found in the Lord. Some might find joy in the sensual pleasures of this life or in the

acquisition of material possessions. But the real joy, the joy that lasts, comes from a personal, living and fruitful relationship with Jesus Christ. You see, it is in the Lord that we enjoy peace with God, help in temptations and the assurance of God's companionship in times of trial.

As much as we desire this joy, there are often hindrances to abiding joy. There is the memory of past failures and the awareness of present faults. This often can leave folks in a state of discouragement or depression. Yet, in this letter in chapter three and verses 12 through 14 Paul provides a solution to this dilemma. He tells them that forgetting the things in the past He is pressing on to the future.

Yet, with some people, their natural temperament of disposition may hinder abiding joy. Some people are just naturally melancholy. They may be genetically predisposed to this attitude or it may be through environmental influences while growing up. However, in Jesus Christ we can be transformed.

To rejoice in the Lord always does not mean we are insensitive to the harsh realities of life. It means that in spite of what life brings to us, we know that radiant joy is found in the Lord. When our relationship with Jesus Christ is what it ought to be, we will have this abiding joy that Paul talks about.

We also commend every member of this congregation for their commitment in being present, inviting others and participating in the work of the local church. Truly it was a wonderful day and we


rejoice and thank God and look forward to bigger and better days in the future as we serve the God of Heaven.


