

LET'S VISIT

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LOVE AND FAULT-FINDING

When Jesus spoke to his followers in John chapter 13, he said to them in verses 34 and 35, "A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another." How have we done through the years at taking Jesus at His word? There is a lot of teaching done about the sins that result from a lack of love for God. However, too often we feel justified in our lack of love for one another. We fail to see that a real love for our brethren in Christ indicates that our heart is right before God. John would write in I John 3:14; "We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren."

When we are quick to judge and condemn others, it is proof of a lack of true humility. Pride has many forms, and one of them is the love of finding fault, the love of assuming an attitude of superiority toward others. A truly humble person knows too much about their own character to take delight in digging out the faults of others. It was James who said; "speak not evil one of another brethren" (James 4:11). The love of finding fault is utterly unchristian.

The more we pry into the acts and motives of other people, the less time we have to question our own acts and motives. And we get to a place where we no longer have a desire to search out our own motives at all. The Bible teaches us to prove our own selves and the more seriously we examine ourselves, the less likely we are to criticize others.

Sadly, for many people, discovering some form of wrong-dong in the life of a brother or sister is not a sorrow but a delight. It brings an opportunity to spread a choice bit of gossip, to cause people's eyes to widen and many tongues to lengthen. James and

Paul condemn this spirit in the same voice. James "speak not evil one of another" and Paul said, "why dost thou set at nought thy brother" (Romans 14:10)

It may be difficult, and sometimes impossible to keep from forming unfavorable opinions of others, but we can all abstain from publishing such opinions to the world. How many times have we suspected someone of wrong-doing only to find later that our suspicions were unfounded? Have you been tempted to repeat some gossip against a brother or sister and then felt thankful you held your tongue when the story proved to be untrue?

To be honest, there are not many if any of us in a position to criticize. Remember the words of Paul in Galatians 6:1; "Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted." However, we often do not have the courage to meet a man or woman face to face and tell them of their sin. Instead, we go to our neighbor and tell them about the sin of our brother or sister, considering ourselves to be great and noble because we have noticed it. What good could such criticism possibly do except prejudice our neighbor against our sinning brother or sister.

The misery and grief caused by this love of finding fault cannot be estimated. When we repeat

The faults of a brother or sister to another we have not accomplished any good. If we tell the brother or sister their fault as we have seen it without a spirit of meekness then we have done nothing but inflict pain and start an argument.

Each of our own lives are so filled with shortcomings that we often see in another the very thing that is running through our own minds. When we are personally acquainted with an evil, it is easy for us to believe others are doing the same thing. Here is what James says on the subject in James 4:12; "There is one lawgiver, who is able to save and to destroy: who art thou that judgest another?"

We must not be quick to find fault. We must not allow ourselves to enjoy picking out the flaws in other people. It is a serious trait of character and we can make the world a much happier place if we learn to control our tempers and our tongues and to remember James' admonition, "speak not evil one of another brethren".

Of course we must say our prayers and read our Bibles-but the object of doing so is to go out into the world and to live for Christ in the shop, the office, the factory and the school.

It is there that our Christianity is seen-or not seen. We are in the Church not only for what we can get out of it, but also for what we can bring out of it to others.


