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FALLEN LIGHTHOUSES

With the advanced navigation instruments that ocean going vessels have today, the Lighthouse of the past has for the most part gone the way of the buggy whip. There are many who still wax nostalgic about lighthouses, who find a certain romanticism about them. My mother was one who had a passion for lighthouses. More than once on a family vacation we went miles out of the way so we could go and look at a lighthouse, if that only meant driving by or stopping and looking through the fence. There is a painting in the foyer of our building that maintains the symbolism of the Church as the Lighthouse of God

Reading about the history of lighthouses, I came across a statement that "a fallen lighthouse is far more dangerous than a reef." The reason for that statement and the truth contained is obvious. Before modern navigation techniques, seamen came to depend on a lighthouse. They would throw caution to the wind when they knew they were being directed away from harm by the light from the lighthouse. Where there was no lighthouse, they were much more careful. Therefore, a lighthouse which was not performing the work it was designed for could become a source of peril. There is a lesson there for us.

An unfaithful child of God is more dangerous than an individual who is not God's child. We come to expect something from Christianity. It is the nature of people to follow the leader and because of this many people are going through life seeing only by the rays of someone else's light. This being true, you can readily see what a tragedy it will be for the one being followd to allow his light to go out. People do

not expect to find anything worthwhile following the life of those who are worldly, however a Christian, one who claims friendship with the Almighty is usually thought of as one who can be trusted. So it is that the faith of many people can be destroyed by a Christian who does not take their responsibilities to the Lord and the church seriously.

The individual who once was faithful to the cause of Christ and has gone back into the world says to those in search of the benefits of Christ's Gospel, "I have tried it and there is nothing to it." Perhaps they do not intend to leave that impression, but they do. Let's consider something else. Before we become too smug and feel this does not apply to us, let's realize that our definition of "going back into the world" is often too narrow. "Going back into the world" involves more than engaging in sinful practices, the lusts of the flesh. It actually means we reach the point that the Lord and the Church are no longer a priority in our lives. When we place our amusements, families and recreation above the Lord, it is then that "we have gone back into the world."

Sadly, there are many good people who have once tasted the good word of God and have fallen away.

- 10.Do something every day that will definitely help the church, and that will prove the worth of the Lord's religion to those around you.


