

LET'S VISIT

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JESUS EXPLAINED GREATNESS

We find an interesting reading in Mark 10:42-45. It seems that Jesus called James and John to him. The other ten apostles were "much displeased" with James and John. You see, there had been a former occasion recorded in Mark 9:33-39 where the disciples had argued about who was the greatest. That was when Jesus had set a little child in the middle of them and taught His disciples that except one became as a little child, he could in no wise enter the kingdom of heaven.

Jesus knew the frailties of human beings. He knew His disciples had not yet fully comprehended the spirit of His religion, but He would not have them again to become embroiled over who should have the chief places in His kingdom. The cross was not far in the future. In view of the experiences they were soon to pass through, if at all possible they needed to have the right frame of mind.

Jesus said, "Ye know that they who are accounted to rule over the Gentiles lord it over them; and their great ones exercise authority over them." (Mark 10:42) A hint! The beginning of a great lesson! No one but Jesus could have thought of delivering such an effective rebuke in such a form of words.

Then there is this sobering statement, "But so shall it not be among you;" (Mark 10:43) In His kingdom, there would be no "great ones" to exercise authority over the others – none with authority to lord it over the rest. In His kingdom there would be no such places of authority as James and John sought. They would exercise no personal authority over others. The authority they had-the only power they possessed-was in the inspired utterances they delivered.

Jesus continued, "But whosoever will be great among you, shall be your minister." (Mark 10:43) A minister! A servant! One who waited on others! Could this be the way to true greatness? The word implies nothing as to the kind of service performed. The kind of service depended upon the will of the master of the servant.

To be great in the kingdom, one must be a great servant. The world calls the man or woman great who succeeds in getting others to serve them. However, God does not see things as we see them. With God, the one who serves most is greatest. "And whosoever of you will be the chiefest, shall be servant of all." (Mark 10:44)

Then Jesus continues, "For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45)

No service was too lowly for Jesus to perform, as we see when he washed the disciples feet. He served the lowliest needs of humanity. He was moved with compassion at the sight of human suffering, and he spent a lot of his time in giving relief to the sick and the afflicted. He fed the hungry, healed the sick, taught the ignorant, rebuked sin, forgave the sinner,

bore with the weak and comforted the sorrowing.

If it be said that He was the Great Teacher, let it also be said that He was the Great Servant, the Great Benefactor, the one who bore our griefs and carried our sorrows.

Peter would tell us that He left us an example that we should follow in His steps. He came to serve and to give his life a ransom for many. He paid the price for the freedom of a slave to sin, the release of a captive held in wickedness, for the life and freedom, of one condemned to death. With Jesus we have a beautiful example of a lack of selfish ambition. Selfish ambition is a hindrance to Christian living and makes us unfit for effective service as Christians.

Instead of boasting of the many things that we are willing to do to show our love for God, let us prove our love by doing the things we are able to do. Let our devotion be so complete that we will live God's kind of life, regardless of the circumstances of life around us.


