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THANK GOD FOR REVERSE!

You know, you don't really appreciate having "reverse" on your automobile until it malfunctions. I remember one time having an Oldsmobile where the transmission was going out and the first thing to go was the reverse gear. You had to be very careful when you went somewhere. You never wanted to park on a flat surface against a curb because that meant you had to push it out. You always wanted to try and park on a hill so you could get out of the parking space. If you parallel parked, you wanted to make sure you were on the end so you could drive straight out. All in all, it presented a very unique set of challenges.

Being able to go in reverse is something we can be grateful for. If we are going the wrong way or we miss a turn, we can back up. Sometimes the best way to correct an error is to back up. I can honestly testify that a car that won't back up is almost not worth having.

Yet, in addition to mechanical reverses there are also physical or material reverses. If someone finds themselves in the wrong job, they can "back up" and find another one. They can change jobs. When we make a purchase, there is the right to return the item for an exchange or refund. If we find ourselves going the wrong way on the freeway, we can take the "idiot turn" and go the opposite direction. In fact, Norma and Abbey will tell you that they designed "idiot turns" with me in mind and I do admit that I make frequent use of them.

However, our greatest need is for spiritual reverses. It was Marshall Keeble, a great preacher of another era who said, "the biggest problem with people is that they just don't want to back up". You see, there are two roads of life. There is the broad way or the narrow way. The right way or the wrong

way. The way of life or the way of death. Sometimes we have to back up to get on the right road of life.

The biblical definition of reverse is repentance. It means to recover one's sense, to come to one's self, to change one's mind. It is a change of conduct to back up and go the right way. Sometimes repentance is defined as being sorry for sins. However, it is more than that. It is like the little boy said in Sunday School class when the teacher asked them what repentance meant he said, "that means being sorry enough to quit."

Repentance is the desired result of preaching. When Noah was preaching before the flood, the desire was to humanity to repent of sin. Jonah went to Nineveh to preach so the people of that great city would repent. When Peter preached on Pentecost, he told those people to "repent and be baptized".

If we are to follow Jesus, we have to repent, we have to reverse our lives. The Christian life begins with a U-Turn from the paths of sin to the paths of righteousness. Yet, repentance, putting ourselves in reverse, backing up is the hardest work of men and women. It is the most difficult thing a proud man or woman is called on to do. But we must repent or we will perish (Luke 13:3) If we are willing to repent, our God is the God of the second chance.




What Inferiority Is Like




