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### LIVING PEACEABLY WITH ALL MEN

The secret of a happy life is in knowing how to live with one's self and with others as well. The Apostle Paul wrote these words, "If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men." (Romans 12:18) It is a basic fact of life that we must live with people. The first law of happiness is to learn how to live with ourselves. You see, every man or woman largely creates the atmosphere in which they live. Some people are always contented, having learned the lesson that "Godliness with contentment is great gain". They are those who have sensed the mind of Paul who said, "I have learned in whatsoever state I am, therein to be content".

It is always a joy to meet up with the person who lives at peace with himself or herself, with their God and with those around them. That individual can rise from their bed in the morning and looking up to God, can say, "It is alright between us" and looking out to others can say, "It is alright between us" and looking within can say to themselves, "it is alright with us". You see, this person is the happiest of people.

Yet, while some people are always at peace with the world, there are others who are continually in warfare. We must understand that people are never attracted to a grouch. No one likes to see someone who looks as though they were weaned on a sour pickle. Faultfinding, complaining, pessimism, and grumpiness repel others rather than drawing them close to us.

We must strive to be encouragers and not discouragers. In case you haven't noticed, this world is full of discouraged folks. There are many people who feel that "no man careth for my soul". They are alone, quite alone in life. They have sorrows of which they dare not speak. There are grievous disappointments unknown to those around them.

There are aspirations they will not talk about. They are alone and discouraged. What is their state of mind? What's to be the joy of tomorrow? What burdens do they pick up as they shoulder the tasks of today and to what sorrows do they come as they approach home at nightfall? Rather than add to the burdens of others, let us "bear one another's burdens".

We often do not realize the power of our words. On a southern railway some years ago, in the days of the steam locomotive, there was a long wooden bridge. On either side of this bridge was the sign, "shut the ash-pan". This was there to warn firemen that they must prevent the dropping of coals upon the wooden timbers while the train was crossing. Perhaps we would do well to heed that with regard to the words we say. If we would live peaceably with others and be encouragers, we must not let hot words fall from our lips that might destroy the structures of love and unity. More than a few troubles have been brought about in this old world because of careless words.

Our hot words are often brought about because of a lack of tolerance for others. If we would heed Paul's admonition to live peaceably with all men we must put the principle Jesus taught in Matthew 7:12 into practice in our lives. "Whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them."


and it will happen in spite of some, but it will happen.

## Across The Preacher's Desk

I once read where someone said the most dangerous thing in the world is to try to leap over a chasm in two jumps. That ranks right up there with the story of the young boy who cut his puppy's tail off an inch at the time so it wouldn't hurt so badly by cutting the entire tail off all at once. Both of those little stories illustrate the tragic mistake many people make about Jesus.

Living for Jesus is not a partial thing nor is it a sometime thing. Living for the Lord is an all or nothing commitment. As we have said on many occasions, if Jesus is not Lord of all of your life, He is not Lord at all in your life. Attempting to live for Jesus without a total commitment is like trying to leap a chasm in two jumps. You leave one bank and miss the other. Here is the way Jesus put it, "He that is not for me is against me". (Matthew 12:30). Jesus Christ will not share a divided heart. We must give him our all, our life, our talents, our service.

The second story shows us another side of commitment to Jesus. You see, Commitment to one thing means forsaking something else. We cannot hold on to the Lord and the world. Often folks try and give up the world like that little boy cut off the puppy's tail, a little at a time. The result is the same, pain is multiplied.

We must commit every part of our lives to Jesus and give up the baubles of the world in cleaving to the Lord. Let's resolve to live for Jesus, wholeheartedly and unreservedly.
